

The text:


- Holy Child within the manger, long ago yet ever near;

 As you lived to heal the broken, greet the outcast, free the bound,
 As you taught us love unspoken, teach us now where you are found.
- Once again we tell the story how your love for us was shown,
 When the image of your glory wore an image like our own.
 Come, enlighten with your wisdom, come and fill us with your grace.
 May the fire of your compassion kindle ev'ry land and race.
- Holy Child within the manger, lead us ever in your way,
 So we see in ev'ry stranger how you come to us today.
 In our lives and in our living give us strength to live as you,
 That our hearts might be forgiving and our spirits strong and true.

Marty Haugen wrote this piece and was first published in 1987 by GIA Publications in his "Night of Silence" collection. We have it in our blue hymnal *With One Voice*. Haugen has written other pieces that we have come to love in this congregation and have helped us to worship such as *That We May Have Life, Now the Feast, Holden Evening Prayer, Neither Death Nor Life,* and numerous others that are in our hymnal. Haugen is a composer of liturgical music for both Roman Catholic and Protestant congregations. Haugen holds a B.A. degree in psychology from Luther College and an M.A. degree in Pastoral Studies from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, MN. He has over 400 compositions published by GIA, Augsburg Fortress and other publishers. For the past 25 years he has presented workshops and concerts across North America and in Europe, the Pacific Rim, Asia and Central America for church musicians and anyone interested in the renewal of worship.

Pizza & Game Night—3rd Friday of the month, 5:30 pm (Dec. 17)



A Message from our ELCA Global Missionary Russian Correspondent


Ongoing ministry-by-extension

After an intensive period of travel this spring, the summer months will see fewer inperson events. At the same time ministry continues — not just in terms of planning off-life educational events and participating in meetings related to strategic planning for development in the Asian part of our church, but also through regular, on-line learning opportunities.

During the past 6 months, the Theological Seminary has begun to host online meetings on Saturdays. This is a very important supplement to the distance education program that the seminary offers, which has very little room for live interaction with teachers and fellow students. These lessons are meant to cover topics that either do not fit in the seminary curriculum or are given only a small place there. This weekend for example, then I will be speaking on the foundations of ecumenism.

Another significant part of my week is dedicated to writing sermons, which are then distributed for adaption by local preachers and use in more than a dozen congregations.

During the Easter season, a new ministry grew out of that need to write a sermon every week – I decided to try an experiment and organize online pericope study meetings, where those who were to preach on the upcoming Sunday would come together to speak about their



ideas. While pastors in the U.S. have probably been doing such things since the beginning of the pandemic, I was not sure if it would be something that would catch on here. As it turns out, though, Easter season is over, and we are still going strong.

Other ideas for online educational ministries are in the works; I will keep you updated.

The other group was hanging outdoor decorations before it turns bitterly cold.







"BITES FOR LIGHTS" CHRISTMAS LIGHT RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Crow Wing County Land Services Department, in cooperation with Sunrise Sertoma of Brainerd and Crow Wing Recycling, is collecting unneeded Christmas lights and extension cords at select locations throughout Crow Wing County. The copper found in the old extension cords and Christmas lights is recycled through Crow Wing Recycling, keeping these materials out of the county landfill.

Social Concerns and Global Missions: Bonnie Stevens

- Several Personal Care Kits and a variety of cookware were delivered this week to Lutheran Social Services in St. Cloud. The kits were put together by several LCC women and some items from the Rummage sale. Another drop-off in St Cloud of is scheduled for November 22. Last week LSS did resettle an Afghan woman in St. Cloud who had completed the Visa process. Since attitudes toward different ethnic groups have changed in the last decades, refugees in Minnesota are being settled in the Twin Cities, Rochester, St. Cloud and Fargo. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service has opened the Fargo office to assist in this process according to an article in Living Lutheran.
- Solar Projects in Africa Pickering Energy Solutions -With 87 solar systems currently installed and
 operating at hospitals and clinics in Liberia, Pickering Energy Solutions is shifting program priorities
 from providing power systems to teaching and resourcing local teams with the capability to operate
 and maintain these systems while developing their indigenous capability to design and install
 systems independently.
- They've received a donation for their program of 890 First Solar panels from RREAL/Global Health Ministries for use in their programs. These panels will be deployed in the future to enhance the existing clinics and for additional systems. There is a need to have a reserve available for maintenance of these 87 systems (which include Phebe and Curran Hospitals) and to help with salaries and training of the individuals caring for the system. If anyone is interested in donating for that purpose, donations can be sent to RREAL at 3963 8th St. SW, Backus MN 56435. Put Liberia reserve fund on the memo line. RREAL is a 501©3 non-profit and can also receive Thrivent Choice dollars.

Children and Family Ministry: Pam Johnson

- Our big event was Trunk or Treat which turned out to be larger than ever we hosted 500 or so kids, and families thoroughly enjoyed it. We had members and non-members hosting trunks with the highlight being the Loge's garbage truck!!
- Carol Smith and Kari adapted our Christmas Pageant to "A Kid's Liturgy for Christmas." Bonnie Stevens has donated a Thrivent Grant to provide life sized nativity pieces which will be used at the pageant and again at the outdoor Christmas Eve service.

- We have Taco Faith coming up on Sunday for Route 56- we will explore how our faith can be explained with taco ingredients while enjoying a taco lunch.
- Kari attended the Church-School meeting with Pastor Drew in Pequot on Tuesday. Sounds like Chat

- Cross Kids continues to thrive we are attracting more kids each week and we look forward to moving to Chapel Hall to take advantage of more room.
