Dear LCC Church family,

We have now entered into the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday, February 22, was the first day of Lent. Its official name is "Day of Ashes" so called because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of the cross. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent - our 40-day journey to Jerusalem, a journey to the cross with Jesus.

During the time of Lent we are called to reflect, repent, and return to the Lord. The Lenten season is a time when we're called to closely examine our lives and seek to be more faithful followers of Christ. As we examine our lives and our attitudes, we may find aspects about ourselves that need to be changed or set aside. When these are revealed to us, we repent and return. Don't be afraid for we come before a God of love. *Return to the Lord your God for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.* Joel 2:12,13. God loves us even in our dustiness. We return ourselves to the One who created us from nothing, and loves us through anything.

This year we will be bringing back the **5th Gospel** for our Lenten messages on Wednesday evenings. Each week a different lay person will share a message about their faith journey or how they have seen God at work in their life. Please support these dear brothers and sisters-in-Christ who are willing to share their stories with us. Come to our **Wednesday evening Lenten service in the sanctuary from 6:20-7:00 PM**. Join us for a delicious free will donation *soup and sandwich supper* beforehand from 5:30-6:10 PM. We pray we will see you on Wednesday evenings to share in this holy season of Lent.

The 2023 Lenten Devotional *Water and Spirit* is in a basket in the narthex. Please take one home with you and enjoy meditating on it at home. If you are able, join us for an hour on Fridays in March at 10:00 AM in the chapel hall or 12:00 Noon at Stonehouse Coffee in Baxter to talk about the week's devotions. It is a beautiful time to gather.



"Beneath the Cross" Keith Getty and Kristyn Getty

- Beneath the cross of Jesus, I find a place to stand;
 And wonder at such mercy that calls me as I am.
 For hands that should discard me, hold wounds which tell me, "Come."
 Beneath the cross of Jesus, my unworthy soul is won.
- Beneath the cross of Jesus, His family is my own.
 Once strangers chasing selfish dreams, now one, through grace alone.
 How could I now dishonor the ones that You have loved?
 Beneath the cross of Jesus, see the children called by God.
- Beneath the cross of Jesus, the path before the crown,
 We follow in His footsteps, where promised hope is found.
 How great the joy before us to be His perfect bride.
 Beneath the cross of Jesus, we will gladly live our lives.

During Lent, we will sing this new-to-us hymn written by Irish contemporary composers Keith and Kristyn Getty. It is loosely based on our "Beneath the Cross of Jesus", written by Elizabeth C. Clephane (1830-1869) found in our hymnal #338. Keith says of this hymn:

While it is true that through the cross we have been given unbelievable promises for the future, its implications for how we live our lives here and now are equally radical. One such implication is how we live together as a community. We are not saved for ourselves; disassociating ourselves from the rest of the body (regardless of how difficult they can be) is simply not an option.

In a concert in 2007, Kristyn Getty summarized the message of the hymn in this way:

The first verse considers the individual coming to the cross and realizing that though they are so desperately unworthy, yet Christ has forgiven them. Then in verse 2, it's as if the camera pans back and we see not just ourselves standing there before the cross, but thousands and thousands of other people there in need of the same gospel, the same Savior, the same grace, and so it asks the question, "How can I then dishonor the ones that you have loved when I consider what Christ has done for me." And then verse 3 pushes us all out together, out the front door if you like, onto this path, beneath the cross, to follow the footsteps of our Lord, where one day it will lead us to be his perfect bride, praising him at his throne.

Kristyn Getty (b. May 22, 1980) is a world-renowned modern hymn writer. Kristyn studied English Literature at Queen's University of Belfast. She writes and performs with her husband, Keith Getty, and they regularly tour the United States and the United Kingdom.

Keith Getty (b. December 16, 1974) is a world-renowned modern hymn writer. Keith developed a passion for writing good songs for the church in his twenties, and began writing for his small Baptist church. He writes and performs with his wife, Kristyn and they regularly tour the United States and the United Kingdom.

Another hymn that Keith co-wrote with Stuart Townend is "The Power of the Cross", a favorite of our congregation.

I love how these cotemporaries write in that they are very similar in style to our traditional hymns, so very singable. The texts are also very relevant to us.

I hope you enjoy the wonderful music and text of "Beneath the Cross" here at Lutheran Church of the Cross during Lent.


March 9, Thursday, 12:00 Noon


Stonehouse Fridays






